

Conditions for carrying out stand parties

Instructions for customers, service providers, stand constructors and organisers

Please, forward this data sheet to the contractor (agency, catering company, booth-constructor, etc.) you have assigned.

This data sheet gives you information on how to prevent harm to any person or property damage in context with having a booth-party.

Also, the general event conditions and the Technical Guidelines of the Messe Frankfurt, as well as the valid and acknowledged rules of technology including the valid rules of the German Institute for Standardization (DIN), VDE, UVV, BGV C1 and MVStättV must be regarded.

1. Only the rented booth area may be used within the framework of an evening event.
2. Booth furniture, tables and chairs may not be placed in the hall aisles.
3. During an event all doors/emergency exits, fire hydrants/extinguishers, escape routes, and the like must strictly be kept clear (see TG 2.1 and 2.2 – Technical Guidelines / Messe Frankfurt 2009).
4. All decorative materials shall comply at least with building materials class B1 of DIN 4102, and/or class C of EN 13501-1, i.e. shall be flame-retardant. (see TG 4.4.1.1)
5. As a general rule, burning candles are prohibited in the fair and exhibition halls. Exceptions may only be made under certain conditions with the agreement of the Fire Prevention Department of the Frankfurt Fire Service, should the candles or candleholders involved be on display as exhibits.
6. Candles out side of the booth area are prohibited.
7. We would like to point out, that the responsibility for losses and secondary damages lies solely with the exhibitor / booth operator.
8. Pyrotechnic demonstrations are not permitted.
9. The usage of balloons filled with security gas and flying objects in the halls must be approved by the Messe Frankfurt, Event Engineering Department (see TG 4.4.1.5).
10. The application of fog machines is to be coordinated with the Messe Frankfurt, Event Engineering Department (see TG 4.4.1.6).
11. The operation of laser equipment is subject to approval by the Messe Frankfurt, Event Engineering Department (see TG 5.10.3).
12. Any kind of musical reproduction shall be subject to provisions of the German Act for Protection of Copyright and Related Property Rights („Urheberrechtgesetz“), § 15 of the German Copyright Act („Urhebergesetz“) (German Federal Law Gazette [BGBl], as amended from time to time), and shall require the approval of GEMA, the musical authors' rights society (see TG 5.13).
13. The installation and operation of beverage dispensing systems is no longer subject to registration; however, the operator of a beverage dispensing system has sole responsibility for its safety and hygiene. It must be possible to demonstrate that said systems are free of any technical or hygienic concerns, and this may in some cases be tested by the Frankfurt Health Authority (see TG 5.14).
14. Heating devices fired by wood, coal, gas, combustible liquids or combustible pastes are prohibited (see TG 5.7.3).
15. Combustible pastes and other fuels are not permitted in the exhibition halls (see TG 5.7.3).
